“ It was a year ago this past Sunday that Dad passed away. While it feels like that day was just yesterday, it also feels like it has been an eternity without him here with me. I spent this Sunday morning watching the sunrise next to Dad's grave and reflecting on how surreal it is that he is gone. As I waited for the light to fill the sky, my heart was overtaken with sadness and grief to have lost such a great friend and wonderful father.

It was that morning that I noticed the inscription on Dad's tombstone. I had seen it before, but I admit that I didn't remember what it said and it had no particular meaning to me beyond the fact that it is a verse of encouragement. But that morning as my heart was as heavy as it has ever been since his passing, I saw a message from Dad I had not seen before. It was as if Dad had thought ahead when selecting his inscription and used the words of Jesus to send a final message. The inscription says "Let not your hearts be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in Me. - John 14:1". At that moment that morning, I felt that Dad picked that verse as his final attempt to make sure we are all OK, as if maybe he was trying one more time to take care of everyone else (as he always did), and to make sure that we know to not let our hearts be troubled because there is light after the darkness.

I am not sure why I am writing this, for I am sure that no one returns to these pages after a few days or weeks after a person passes. Maybe I just wanted to write out my thoughts and feelings, or maybe I just wanted to write this in hopes that Dad would somehow know just how much I still love him and how much I miss my mentor, my friend, my rock, and my father.
